General course enquires:	Answer:
Career Pathways after completion of the course	After successfully completing the ISNC course you will be eligible to sit the NAATI CPI test. The CPI Credential is the entry level of Certification. There are areas in the Interpreting industry which require higher Certification levels.
Is this a language specific course?	No, this is not a language specific course. Students will be paired with other students who speak the same language where possible for language specific discussions and practical activities. However, students will be given one opportunity to receive language specific feedback for their interpreting abilities. This exercise is covered by the course fees with no extra charges.
Are there any assessments during the course and how many?	Students must demonstrate competence in all units through assessment. There are 7 assessments in the course. Assessments will include quizzes, activities, role-plays (interpreting) and research.
I am a Certified Provisional Interpreter, do I need this online course to be able to sit NAATI's Certified Interpreter test?	No, there are other pathways to become eligible to sit for the NAATI Certified Interpreter test. See: NAATI Certification Pathways

	The Welcome email after submitting your Expression of Interest (application via our website) will give you full information.
When will AUSLAN be offered in the online training?	It is offered two times a year in March and August (subject to student numbers).
I acquired an Advanced Diploma of Interpreting some time ago, do I still need to enrol myself in this kind of course again in order to sit for the certification test?	The Advanced Diploma is a pathway for the Certified Interpreter level. However, if you gained it before 2016, you may have to do this course. You will also need to check with NAATI regarding the status of the institution which delivered your qualification. If it was not an endorsed institution you will need to complete NAATI's Ethics and Intercultural Modules. Contact NAATI to check your status.
If I do the TAFE SA online course, do I still have to sit for an English proficiency test?	<p>Before you are accepted to do the online training, you will have to: either provide evidence of your English proficiency level or sit for an online English proficiency test.</p> <p>Evidence of English proficiency:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) completion of primary and secondary schooling in an English speaking country; or b) completion of secondary and tertiary studies in an English speaking country; or c) a recognised English proficiency test score. For English proficiency levels required by NAATI see: NAATI English Proficiency requirement <p>You will be required to upload evidence, regarding your English proficiency, when you are invited to the course.</p> <p>If you don't have the above evidence you will be required to sit for an online English proficiency test before enrolling into the course.</p>

<p>If I apply for the NAATI intercultural competency course and their Ethics course, do I still need to do the TAFE SA online course?</p>	<p>Yes. The NAATI intercultural and Ethics competence online course is only for people who already have had training or previous recognised T&I qualifications. Go to NAATI Certification Pathways for further information.</p>
<p>What are the course prerequisites?</p>	<p>Applicants will have to meet English and AUSLAN proficiency requirements before enrolment. A screening test will be organised by TAFE SA prior to enrolment to assess applicants' AUSLAN proficiency.</p> <p>For English proficiency levels required by NAATI, visit: NAATI English Proficiency requirement</p>
<p>Who is eligible to enrol in the course?</p>	<p>Anyone, except Student 500 to 590 Visa holders. Once the language proficiency requirements have been met.</p>
<p>I live in a different state in Australia. Can I study the course online?</p>	<p>Yes. This is an online course and students can join from anywhere in Australia.</p>
<p>I submitted my application but wish to correct my information, how can I do that?</p>	<p>Please email the contact email for TAFE SA. Please do not phone.</p> <p>TAFE SA web link: TafeSA Website</p>
<p>How long should I wait till I get a response after submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI)?</p>	<p>You will receive a welcome email within two weeks of lodging your EOI. You will then be contacted as soon as AUSLAN is scheduled for training.</p>
<p>Can I purchase textbooks or learning materials?</p>	<p>You don't need to. All study material is provided.</p>
<p>Can I have information about specialised interpreters like Conference interpreter? How do I become one?</p>	<p>The course only caters for NAATI's entry-level tests, i.e. Certified Provisional Interpreter test. You should go to the NAATI webpage: NAATI.com.au</p>

INTERPRETING SKILLS FOR NAATI CERTIFICATION PRE-REQUISITE TRAINING (AUSLAN) FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

If I successfully complete this course, am I certified as an Interpreter?	You will need to sit the NAATI test to become certified
I want to become an interpreter. What should I study in order to sit for the NAATI test?	If there are programs at universities or TAFEs available in AUSLAN, you should study those programs. They would provide you with the best preparation to become an AUSLAN interpreter. These short online courses are there to fill the gap where there are no full qualifications available.
What are the chances of getting certification after successfully completing this online course?	It depends on your bilingual competency, interpreting skills and contextual knowledge at the time when you sit for the test.
Fees:	Answer:
How much will the course cost?	Fees are as follows: ISNC (Interpreting) \$1,592.00. Please note fees may be subject to change. The South Australian State Government funding subsidies apply for South Australian students. Eligibility criteria apply. Refer to the website for updated subsidised fee cost.
I am a pensioner, how much would it be?	If eligible for State Government funding (SA students only) there will be a concession price for those that hold a current concession card.
Can I apply for HECS-HELP or VET fee help or Government Subsidised fund?	No, unfortunately, these are not available for short national online courses. However you may be eligible to pay the fees via Standard Payment Plan. Conditions apply .
Can I apply for Standard Payment Plan?	Yes. Please email the course administration once you receive the welcome email. Eligibility criteria apply .
If I start the course and then decide I want to continue at another time, can I do that?	The course fees are not refundable after the start date. In extreme circumstances, we are able to refund part/all of your fees, but you will need a medical certificate or similar.

<p>If I am away in the middle of the course for a few weeks, can I catch up?</p>	<p>No, if this is your situation you will need to apply for a later course. Attendance to the online sessions is compulsory. If you do not attend, you will be marked as 'withdrawn' and will have to re-enrol and pay again.</p>

<p>What are the course dates for 2022?</p>	<p>The 2022 course dates are as follows:</p> <p>14 March – 27 May Expressions of Interest close 10 December 2021</p> <p>29 August – 11 November Expressions of Interest close 10 June 2022</p>
<p>Is this purely an online course or do I need to physically attend classes at TafeSA Adelaide?</p>	<p>This is purely an online course. You will have to attend live online sessions once per week for 2.5 hours. You can attend these sessions from anywhere providing you have reasonable internet connection.</p>
<p>Can I take this online course outside of Australia?</p>	<p>Yes, but you need to be able to obtain a USI (Unique Student Identifier).</p>
<p>I need a flexible timetable for the online course, can I know the schedule before I consider the enrolment?</p>	<p>The live online session times will change every cycle, depending on the number of students and staff availability. The schedule will be made available before enrolment.</p>
<p>I missed the enrolment, when is the next enrolment date?</p>	<p>See "What are the course dates" above</p>
<p>When does the course start? How many times per year do you run it?</p>	<p>Visit TAFE SA web link: TafeSA Website</p> <p>There will be two courses per year. See "What are the course dates" above</p>
<p>Can I start the online course anytime I want?</p>	<p>No. Courses start at a particular time, two times per year.</p>

<p>I live in a different state in Australia. Can I have face-to-face classes in my state?</p>	<p>Some TAFEs offer this skill set face to face in different states. You need to check with the various Tafe Institutes in your state.</p>
<p>Can I take the online course while I am travelling overseas?</p>	<p>Yes, as long as you have a reliable internet connection to log into class and do your online work.</p>
<p>How many hours per week should I expect to commit to this course? Can I choose when to attend the sessions?</p>	<p>You must attend the synchronous sessions assigned to you (i.e. online sessions delivered in real-time) at the scheduled time (2.5 hours per week). You can also expect to spend at least 4 hours per week on your online course and assessments.</p>
<p>Can I complete at my own pace as long as I complete the courses within the 10-week deadline?</p>	<p>You must attend the synchronous sessions assigned to you (i.e. online sessions delivered in real-time) at the scheduled time (2.5 hours per week). You can study at your own pace in relation to the non-synchronous parts of the course as long as you keep up with the weekly schedule. The course is planned week by week and you will need to progress week by week and hand in your assessments when they are due.</p>

<p>I understand that NAATI re-certification occurs every 3 years if I am working overseas on a permanent basis, how do I get my certificate renewed?</p>	<p>The process is all done online.</p>
<p>After completion of the course, can I sit for the NAATI test?</p>	<p>Yes, providing you have applied to NAATI and you apply within 2 years of your course completion.</p>

<p>I was an accredited interpreter but failed to revalidate. How do I re-obtain my certification?</p>	<p>You will need to contact NAATI.</p>
<p>What is the pathway from Provisional Certified Interpreter to Certified Interpreter?</p>	<p>Visit the link: NAATI Certification Pathways (scroll to 'Certified Interpreter')</p>
<p>I failed to re-validate my NAATI certificate and need to re-sit the NAATI test. Do you have a short course on ethics?</p>	<p>If you complete this course, you will be eligible to sit the relevant NAATI test. You should contact NAATI to check your requirements.</p>
<p>How do I become a Conference Interpreter in Australia?</p>	<p>You can get training at universities if they cater to AUSLAN. Visit link for possible pathways: NAATI Certification Pathways (scroll to 'Certified Conference Interpreter').</p>
