Admission criteria

A. Applicants with higher education study

You may use your previous higher education study for entry into the Bachelor of Hospitality, Tourism and Events Management if you have completed:

- > At least six months of full-time (or part time equivalent) study in a higher education course
- OR
- > A 12-month, full-time foundation or bridging course.

There is no time limit on when your previous study was commenced or completed.

You may also be eligible for credit for your previous higher education studies, which can decrease the time it takes to complete your degree at TAFE SA. Credit for previous higher education study is assessed on a case-by-case basis at the time of enrolment.

B. Applicants with Vocational Education and Training (VET) study

If you have completed a Certificate IV level course or higher in a Hospitality, Tourism or Events-related area at a Registered Training Organisation (RTO), you will be eligible for entry to the Bachelor of Tourism, Hospitality and Events Management.

C. Applicants with work and life experience (includes those who left secondary education more than 2 years ago)

Academic results

You may still use your year 12 results for entry to the Bachelor of Tourism, Hospitality and Events Management, even if you completed secondary education more than two years ago and have not undertaken VET or higher education study since then.

You must have:

- > Met the requirements for the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) or its equivalent, or completed the International Baccalaureate (IB).

Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)

If you have not completed secondary education, did not achieve a high enough ATAR, or have not previously completed VET or higher education study, you may gain entry into the Bachelor of Tourism, Hospitality and Events Management by achieving a minimum score of 140 in the STAT.

The STAT is a two-hour, multiple choice test that assesses your ability to study at a tertiary level.

D. Applicants with recent secondary education (within the past two years)

Australian Year 12 students

If you have completed year 12 in Australia within the past two years, you will be eligible for entry into the Bachelor of Tourism, Hospitality and Events Management if you:

- > Met the requirements for the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) or the interstate equivalent, or completed the International Baccalaureate (IB).

Overseas or non-standard secondary education

If you have completed your secondary education overseas or in a non-standard program, your academic results will be assessed to determine their equivalence.
