In the acting industry, the following areas need to be considered:

Observation skills and abilities

- Observe performances and acting methods of other students
- Respond to constructive feedback and or questions

Communication skills and abilities

- Participate in discussion with other students
- Communicate and work with other people as a team
- Receive, reflect and act on constructive feedback in developing performance skills
- Initiate and sustain communication with a range of people
- Understand and follow written and verbal instructions
- Report and record work health and safety hazards and risks

Technical and or motor skills and abilities

- Have a range of Information Technology (IT) skills

Cognitive skills and abilities

- Be responsible for one's own learning
- Seek support to improve work performance
- Problem solving (e.g. showing independence and initiative in identifying and solving problems)
- Learning new ideas and techniques
- Follow instructions
- Read, analyse, discuss and learn complex text (e.g. scripts, playwrights)
- Memorise large sections of texts for performances
- Reflect meaningfully on own skills/ performance

Behavioural and social skills and abilities

- Work as part of a team and/or independently
- Communicate effectively with a range of people
- Support other students in planning, rehearsing and performing tasks
- Managing, organising and planning your time effectively
