



## DIPLOMA OF INTERPRETING (LOTE-ENG) PSP50922

### INFORMATION SHEET

<b>Purpose:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The Diploma of Interpreting (PSP50922) course provides you the opportunity to learn the necessary skills to effectively interpret in a range of settings.</li><li>• The qualification examines interpreting in areas of community services, health, education, employment, law, immigration and citizenship.</li><li>• You will be able to concentrate on language-specific terminology with a tutor who is a certified and experienced interpreter in your language.</li><li>• If you are already certified, you can use the Diploma of Interpreting (PSP50922) as professional development and as a way of gaining greater skills and experience.</li></ul>
<b>Duration of the course:</b>	12 months, part time Course starts February and finishes in November
<b>Study mode:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The course is delivered online with interactive live classes, as well as online materials for study and assessment.</li><li>• Regular attendance to classes is expected.</li><li>• Classes are held in the evening, twice a week (duration of 3 hours each). Some tutorial classes may be scheduled during the day subject to student availability.</li></ul>
<b>Requirements:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Acceptance into the course is subject to an oral language proficiency test in your LOTE (Language other than English) and English.</li><li>• A fee of \$40 will be charged to cover administration costs.</li><li>• Testing dates are conducted in November based on language groups.</li><li>• Languages offered are determined by the number of applications for each language.</li><li>• Once languages have been determined, information on the entry test will be emailed to you.</li><li>• Applicants to languages that do not go ahead will also be notified.</li></ul>
<b>Course structure:</b>	There are 12 units in the Diploma of Interpreting. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Apply codes and standards to ethical practice (PSPTIS102)</li><li>• Prepare to translate or interpret (PSPTIS104)</li><li>• Manage interactions in general settings (PSPTIS114)</li></ul>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Build glossaries for translating and interpreting assignments (PSPTIS103)</li> <li>• Interpret in general dialogue settings (PSPTIS112)</li> <li>• Use routine subject area terminology in two languages (PSPTIS115)</li> <li>• Demonstrate routine language proficiency in different subjects and cultural contexts (PSPTIS116)</li> <li>• Interpret through communication media (PSPTIS133)</li> <li>• Interpret in general monologue settings (PSPTIS113)</li> <li>• Sight translate (PSPTIS135)</li> <li>• Use routine health terminology in two languages (PSPTIS118)</li> <li>• Use routine legal terminology in two languages (PSPTIS119)</li> </ul> <p>If you have already completed the <i>Introduction to Interpreting Skill Set</i> (PSPSS00063), you will not need to repeat the units covered in the skill set.</p>

<p><b>NAATI certification:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Diploma of Interpreting (PSP50922) is endorsed by the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters (NAATI) and is the preferred and recommended pathway by NAATI to the Certified Provisional Interpreter test.</li> <li>• Please note that applications for NAATI testing must be submitted directly to NAATI. This will incur an additional cost.</li> </ul>										
<p><b>Other requirements of the course:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You will need a strong internet connection and laptop/computer to attend online live sessions.</li> <li>• You will also need strong computer skills in order to complete and upload assessments. Many assessments are to be completed in Microsoft Word documents, therefore word processing skills are essential.</li> <li>• You will need to be available to attend classes regularly in the evenings twice per week, and be able to allocate approx. 6 additional hours per week of private study (details of study load will also be outlined in the information session mentioned below).</li> </ul>										
<p><b>Fees:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• South Australian residents: Australian citizens &amp; permanent residents may be eligible for SA Subsidised Fees</li> </ul>

<b>To apply:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Please apply via the TAFESA website Diploma of Interpreting (Spoken Language) - <a href="#">Languages, Interpreting and Translating - TAFE SA</a></li><li>• Minimum numbers are required for each language.</li><li>• This means the language you select may not be delivered if minimum numbers are not met.</li></ul>
