Through this **FREE***, 2-year, part time course, you'll receive training that will help with:

- > generating networking contacts
- > raising awareness of gender issues in society, locally and globally

Classes will be delivered at TAFE SA's city campus, 120 Currie Street, Adelaide, with some sessions being held in an online virtual classroom.

Upon successful completion of the program, graduates earn the qualification: Certificate IV in Women's Advocacy (Leadership) (11202NAT).
