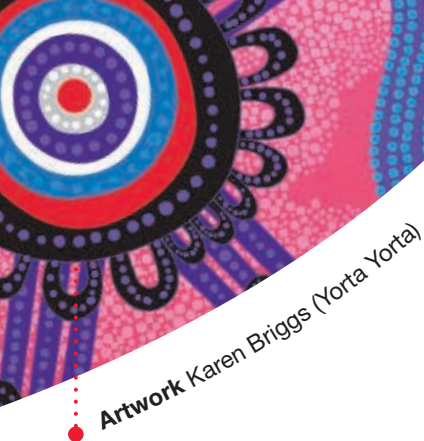
While our Reflect RAP provided us with a strong foundation for learning, understanding, and introspection, we now look to the future with a clear focus on further action. We are ready to implement bold initiatives that build on the progress already made and address the key challenges identified through our first RAP.

If you identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student, you'll have access to TAFE SA's Aboriginal Access Centre throughout your study. The Aboriginal Access Centre delivers a variety of programs in metropolitan, regional, and remote areas, and helps with enrolments into TAFE SA courses.

The centre also offers mentoring by training support officers, who act as a link between you and your lecturers and assist you in developing your individualised learning plan. See page 13 for more information.

Since the early 1980s, TAFE SA has had a presence in the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara (APY) Lands, providing key support and training services for local communities. Currently, we have six learning sites in the APY Lands that offer work readiness and skills. We're immensely proud to work with local stakeholders and community members to deliver tailored training solutions.

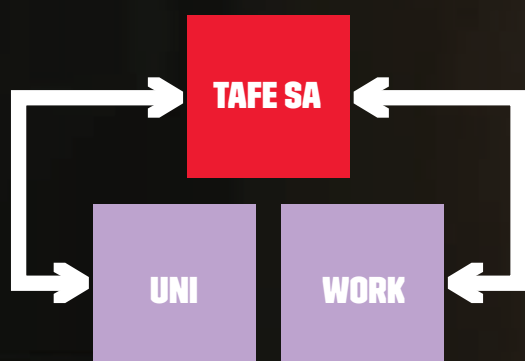

SUPPORT FOR ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER STUDENTS

TAFE SA's Aboriginal Access Centre delivers an innovative range of programs to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students across South Australia, including in regional and remote locations. The centre can also help with enrolment into other TAFE SA qualifications.

COURSES AVAILABLE

- > community services

STUDENT SUPPORT

Training support officers are available for students to offer support with individual learning plans to map pathways to higher education or employment. A training support officer will also work closely with lecturers to ensure you have the support you need.

THE ABORIGINAL TUTORIAL ASSISTANCE SCHEME (ATAS)

Free tutoring assistance is available through ATAS to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who are enrolled in TAFE SA courses or training programs at Certificate III level qualifications or higher. Eligible full-time students have access to up to two hours tutoring per week, for up to 34 weeks.

FEE HELP

You may be eligible for financial assistance for a portion of your TAFE SA course fees through the Aboriginal Access Centre's Equity Grants. Contact your local training support officer for more information.

OPTIONS FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS

If you are a school student, TAFE SA has some great options to help you get ahead.

Gain nationally recognised qualifications while completing your South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

FLEXIBLE INDUSTRY PATHWAY PROGRAMS

The South Australian Government's Flexible Industry Pathways (FIP) is a subsidised program available for students turning 16 years or older and enrolled in Year 11 or Year 12. Students study with TAFE SA while undertaking their SACE, and graduate with a nationally recognised qualification from Certificate II to Certificate III level.

SPECIALISED COURSES FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS (STACKABLE VET SKILLS CLUSTERS)

TAFE SA provides accredited short courses tailored for high school students, who are able to apply from the age of 15 years and in Year 10. These courses are part of the South Australian Government's "Stackable VET" program, equipping students with valuable vocational skills, preparing them for the workforce, and offering opportunities to explore various fields before committing to a qualification that they can do (either as a FIP in school as part of their SACE or once they are finished school). Stackable VET courses completed in Years 11 and 12 may also contribute credits towards a student's SACE at either Stage I or Stage II level.

SCHOOL-BASED APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS

Secondary school students can begin an apprenticeship or traineeship in Years 10, 11 or 12, combining paid employment and structured work-related training as part of their SACE. This allows students to earn while they learn, and graduate with on-the-job training and skills, in addition to their SACE.

Students who are still at school can speak to their VET Coordinator or career counsellor to explore industries and apprenticeships that match their interests.

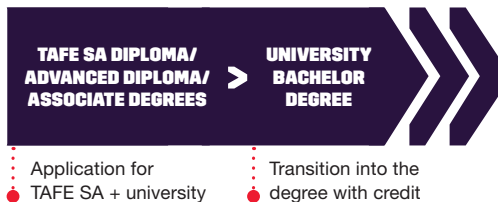
PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

TAFE SA is a great option if you prefer a hands-on and supportive learning environment or are seeking an alternative entry to university.

DUAL OFFER COURSES

If you would like guaranteed entry to university, with dual offer courses, you apply only once through SATAC and are accepted into both a TAFE SA Diploma/Advanced Diploma/Associate Degree AND a connected university Bachelor program. This means that once you complete your TAFE SA course successfully, you have guaranteed entry – with credit – into university, without needing to apply for university again.

You'll also benefit from TAFE SA's vocational experience and insights, as well as graduating with two qualifications instead of one.



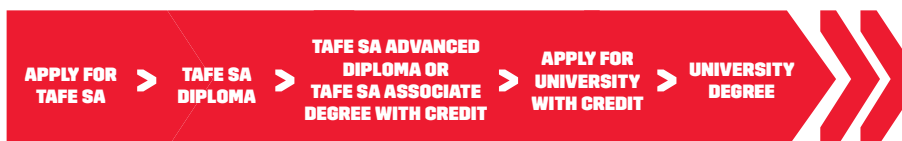
CREDIT TRANSFER

TAFE SA has many credit transfer agreements with universities for TAFE SA graduates. These can provide some advanced standing in university courses if you wish to undertake further education.

Credit transfer recognises the parts of a TAFE SA qualification that are equivalent in content and level to parts of some university programs.

To claim credit, you must formally apply to the university in accordance with their processes and you may need to show evidence of your previous studies, such as your qualification parchment.

Being eligible for credit does not guarantee that you will be offered a place in the university program. Credit will normally only be granted after you have been offered a place.



UNIVERSITY TO TAFE SA

Many university students also undertake TAFE SA qualifications to increase their employability by gaining industry-specific practical skills.





HIGHER EDUCATION

TAFE SA is not only a Vocational Education Provider, we are also an Institute of Higher Education, registered with the Tertiary Education Quality Standards Agency, offering unique benefits to higher education students.

THE DEFENCE INDUSTRY

The defence industry aids the Australian Defence Force by supplying the workforce that supports its operations. It consists of a skilled workforce with expertise in trades, technical fields, science, and technology, capable of designing, manufacturing, and maintaining military equipment, transport, infrastructure, and facilities. The sector also encompasses areas like intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance, as well as cyber and other electronic and information-related capabilities.

The most significant program of growth in Australia's history has begun, and the scale of the defence industry projects that our state has secured means we are embarking on a journey of unprecedented opportunity.

NAVAL SHIPBUILDING IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Over the next three decades, Australia's naval shipbuilding industry will construct and sustain (maintenance, service and upgrade) various vessels for the Australian Defence Force at the Osborne Naval Shipyard. This includes Hunter Class frigates, Hobart Class AirWarfare Destroyers (AWD), Collins Class submarines, and SSN-AUKUS conventionally armed, nuclear-powered submarines.

SSN-AUKUS SUBMARINES

The SSN-AUKUS submarines will be the most complex ships ever constructed. They will be based on the UK's next generation design, incorporating technology from Australia, the UK, and the US. Nuclear-powered submarines offer superior stealth, speed and range.

Joint operations with Allied countries will conduct intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance during peacetime. These conventionally armed, nuclear-powered submarines, operated by the Royal Australian Navy, will require the attainment of a nuclear mindset for the safe, secure, and effective management of this capability, for its lifetime.

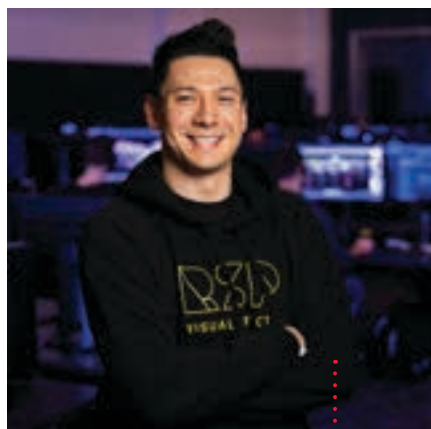

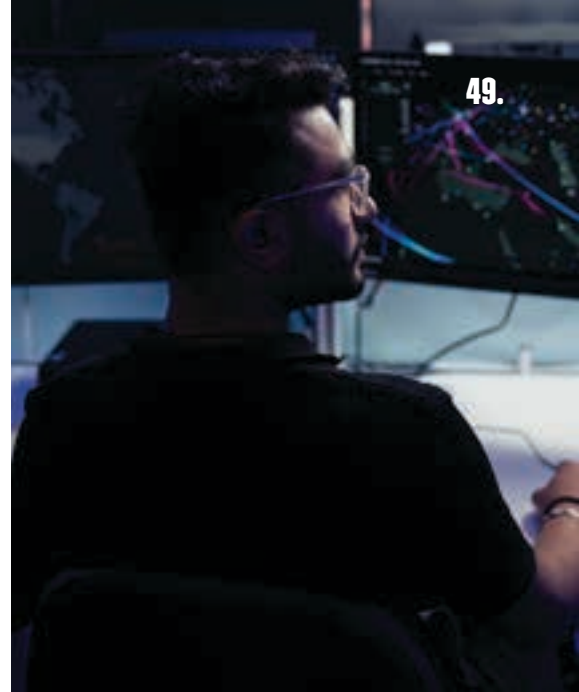

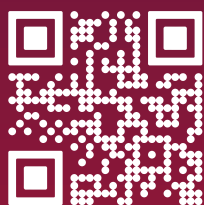
