TAFE SA is planning to improve access and expand the delivery of training programs in your region. In order to do this, we need to be more innovative and flexible in the way we deliver our services to students and we must improve access to quality training.

TAFE SA plans to deliver training through a variety of training methodologies including:

- standard face to face training in classrooms and ‘training hubs’
- applied practical training through mixed delivery in well-equipped workshops, skills labs, studios etc
- online training supported by facilitators to increase flexibility and access for metro and regional students studying through key TAFE SA facilities and off-site locations.

Our face to face training delivered in intensive workshops or at a site will include:

- lecturers travelling to community locations (town halls, footy clubs, libraries) with modern classroom technology or
- lecturers travelling to sheep stations, vineyards, childcare centres, forests etc to train students in the practical skills required of their vocational study.
