TAFE SA Guidelines for International Students on:

- 1. Genuine Student and Genuine Temporary Entry**
- 2. Student Visa Living Costs and Evidence of Funds for International Applicants**

These guidelines are to be read in accordance with the TAFE SA International Student – Admissions and Enrolment Policy. The Department of Immigration & Border Protection (DIBP) requires that international students on a student visa:

1. be here for the main purpose of study and, therefore, temporarily stay in Australia in order to obtain a successful education outcome.
2. must maintain sufficient funds to pay for travel, tuition and living expenses for themselves, their partner and any dependants for the duration of their stay in Australia.

Background to Genuine Entry, Genuine Temporary Entry Status and Living Costs/Evidence of Funds

Student visa applicants must prove they are a genuine student (GS) and a genuine temporary entrant (GTE). Without this, applicants will unlikely receive a student visa. TAFE SA must ensure that an applicant is a GTE prior to making the student visa submission. In addition students must ensure they have enough money to pay for travel, tuition and living expenses for themselves, their partner and any dependants for the duration of their stay in Australia. Under the Streamlined Visa Processing (SVP) arrangements, TAFE SA must ensure applicants meet these criteria.

Assessing and Determining GS/GTE Status and Sufficient Funds.

In order to determine whether an applicant is a GS/GTE and/or has sufficient funds to pay for travel, tuition and living expenses for themselves, their partner and any dependants for the duration of their stay in Australia an applicant *may* be required to complete a TAFE SA GTE Applicant Assessment Form and provide documentary evidence of funds.

All information and documentation submitted as part of the assessment process must be submitted in English, original certified documents and be no more than 6 months old. Any documents supplied with foreign currency will be converted into Australian dollars using the currency conversion of the day of the assessment, typically using <http://www.xe.com/currencyconverter/>

A successful applicant will be deemed to be a GS/GTE by TAFE SA. This decision will remain valid for 2 years from the date of assessment.

Should a student deemed a GS/GTE defer their commencement date with TAFE SA they will not be required to undergo a further GTE assessment if within a 2 year period from the original GTE Assessment date.

Should a student deemed a GS/GTE apply to change their program the applicant may need to complete a new GTE Applicant Assessment Form.

If TAFE SA determines that an applicant is not a GS/GTE the applicant will be ineligible for admission into partnered courses at TAFE SA for 2 years from the date of assessment.



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Should DIBP refuse to grant an applicant a student visa the applicant will be ineligible for admission into partnered courses at TAFE SA for 2 years from the date that TAFE SA becomes aware of such refusal.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate that they have sufficient funds for their first 12 months in Australia. In some circumstances, applicants may be required to demonstrate that they have sufficient funds for more than 12 months. If TAFE SA determines that an applicant does not have the sufficient funds TAFE SA will not provide the applicant with a Letter of Offer.

Withdrawal of Offers

If a student receives a TAFE SA Letter of Offer as an international student, but fails to complete any required assessment or document submission, and TAFE SA believes the applicant does not have the required sufficient funds or is not a GS/GTE, TAFE SA may withdraw any Letter of Offer.

If TAFE SA suspects that information or supplied documentation from the applicant or their representative was incorrect, misleading or fraudulent, TAFE SA reserves the right to withdraw any Offers for that applicant. TAFE SA may, at its discretion, refuse any further applications for course admission from the applicant for 2 years.

An applicant, not originally required to complete the GTE Applicant Assessment Form and/or show financial capacity, may, at TAFE SA's discretion, be required to complete one or provide evidence, particularly should the student's or external circumstances change. Should the applicant not complete this assessment or complete the assessment but fail to demonstrate they are GS/GTE, TAFE SA reserves the right to withdraw any Offers for that applicant. TAFE SA may also choose to not consider any further applications from the applicant for 2 years.

TAFE SA reserves the right to withdraw any Offers at any time, including where an applicant has accepted and paid for their place, and been issued a Confirmation of Enrolment (refer to the International Student Tuition Fee Refund Policy for more information).

General

TAFE SA may amend these Guidelines and any related policies at any time. The process, assessment and results of any GS/GTE/financial assessment are confidential and remain the property of TAFE SA. TAFE SA will not be under any obligation to disclose or provide a copy of the process, assessment or results to applicants, any educational institution or other third party unless required by law to do so but may disclose GS/GTE/financial assessment results to its University partners.
