COURSES FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS

TAFE SA's courses for school students are designed for students in Years 10 to 12. They provide the opportunity to learn specific industry skills and gain credit towards a nationally recognised qualification, all while undertaking and receiving points towards their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

There are two ways you can study Arts and Design with TAFE SA while in Years 10 to 12:

1. FLEXIBLE INDUSTRY PATHWAYS PROGRAMS

The South Australian government's Flexible Industry Pathways (FIP) Program is available for students turning 16 years or older and enrolled in Year 11 or 12 in 2026. Students study with TAFE SA while undertaking their SACE and graduate with a nationally recognised qualification at either Certificate II or Certificate III level. For students to be eligible for a FIP course, they are first required to complete the VET Readiness Orientation (VETRO) process, which includes the application process.

2. STACKABLE VET SKILLS CLUSTERS

TAFE SA has additional accredited courses especially for school students. These courses are part of the South Australian government's "Stackable VET" program and provide students with highly valued vocational skills, preparing them for the workplace and allowing them to try out different areas before committing to a qualification (either in-school or post-school). Stackable VET courses may earn credit towards a student's SACE, with Introductory Stackable courses available for Year 10 and 11 students, and Advanced Stackable courses available for Year 11 and 12 students. These are generally delivered one day per week, either over one term or one semester, unless specified otherwise. VET qualifications studied in school can be valuable for students considering university-level qualifications. From a Certificate III qualification completed in school, students can apply for a dual offer course (gaining acceptance for both a TAFE SA qualification and a Degree qualification at the same time, **with no ATAR entrance requirement**) or study a Diploma post-school and gain credit transfer later to a related qualification.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The majority of TAFE SA courses do not have entry requirements. For courses that have entry requirements, you may need to meet certain selection criteria or course admission requirements to be accepted into a course.

This may include:

- > completing the Australian Core Skills Profile for Adults (CSPA) test which ensures satisfactory reading, writing and numeracy skills to assist and support to succeed
- > portfolio submission
- > written assessments
- > auditions.

INTAKES

Courses may have two intakes a year – Semester 1 for a January start and Semester 2 for a July start. Some courses have continuous intakes where offers are made throughout the year, allowing you to start in any term.

STUDY COSTS

Fee information can be found on the course pages of the TAFE SA website.

The cost of a course depends on the number of hours of training, the type of study involved, and specialist materials required.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

You may be eligible for fee concession, fees by instalments, grants, or scholarships. VET Student Loans are available for selected qualifications, providing eligibility criteria are met.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

TAFE SA may recognise your previous study or work experience, which may reduce the time needed to complete your qualification. You can apply to have your previous study assessed, to see where it is equivalent in content and learning outcomes to your planned study. Visit tafesa.edu.au/rpl

CREDIT TRANSFER FOR PREVIOUSLY COMPLETED STUDIES

Credit transfer allows you to receive credit for previously completed unit(s) of competency. It is important to apply for your recognition for credit transfer at enrolment, or as close to enrolment as possible, to confirm your final fee.

APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS
